Language requirements

Université de Montréal is a French taught institution and almost all courses are given in French. Proof of minimum B2 (from the Common European framework) French proficiency is therefore required. Some departments may require a higher level and official tests; see the list of <u>programs with particular requirements</u> for further details.

Students who are not from a French-speaking institution must provide a certificate/letter delivered by an accredited institution (home university's language department, French Alliance, language schools, etc.).

French courses: Non-French-speaking students can take one French language course (3 credits) per term offered by the UdeM Language School (students will be charged around 75\$ for course materials). A placement test will be required, information will be provided to students once admitted. Please see our website for further details.

Immigration

It is the students' responsibility to ensure that immigration requirements are met and that they carry out the necessary immigration procedures to study abroad at UdeM.

Procedures and timeframes may differ according to the student's nationality, the length of the exchange and the activities to be undertaken.
